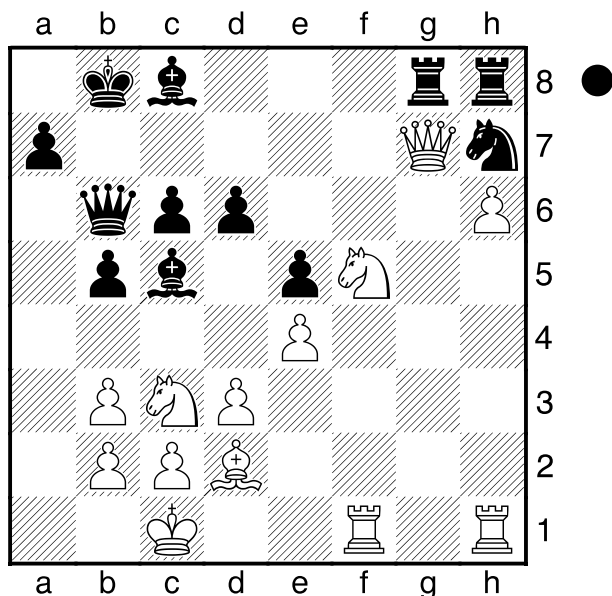

1.e4 e5 2.Nc3 Nf6 3.Bc4 Bc5 4.d3 d6 5.f4 Nc6 6.f5 Na5 7.Qf3 c6 8.g4 h6 9.h4 b5 10.Bb3 Nxb3 11.axb3 h5 12.gxh5 Nxb3 13.Nge2 Qb6 14.Ng3 Nf6 15.Bg5 Bb7 16.h5 Nh7 17.Bd2 0-0-0 18.h6 g6 19.0-0-0 Rhg8 20.fxc6 fxc6 21.Rdf1 Kb8 22.Qf7 Rh8 23.Qxc6 Rdg8 Is black SKEWERING A PIECE? **24.Qg7** No way says white. Offering the Queen in exchange for a rook. Black cannot take the queen without dire consequences. See the variation to see why. **Bc8** [24...Rxc6 25.hxc6 Rg8 26.Rxh7 Qd8 27.Nh5 Bc8 28.Nf6 d5 29.exd5 cxd5 30.Ncxd5 Be6 31.Nxc6 Bxc6 32.Rh8 And black is busted.] **25.Nf5** Diagram



Bringing in more pieces! **Bxf5** Black is hoping that by trading off pieces he can CONSOLIDATE. **26.Rxf5 Bb4** White's queen still can't be taken. See the variation to see why. [26...Rxc6 27.hxc6 Rg8 28.Rxh7 Qd8 29.Bh6 d5 30.exd5 cxd5 31.Rxe5 Qf6 32.Rxd5 Bd4 33.Rxb5+ Kc8 And white is crushing.] **27.Kb1 Bxc3 28.bxc3 Nf8 29.Rhf1**

C26 Ng6 30.Qd7 Time to Bounce. **Rd8 31.Qe6 Nf4** [31...Rhg8 32.h7 Game over.; 31...Rdg8 32.Rf7 And white will have his way on the 7th RANK.] White easily wins a pawn. More important than the pawn, white cannot have some measly knight coming in between his DOUBLED ROOKS! **32.Bxf4 exf4 33.R5xf4 Qc5 34.Rf7** Grabbing the 7th RANK like every greedy dog should! **Qg5** There is not much for black to do. **35.Rf8** Because of the eventual Qxd6 FORKING move, black cannot take. **Qc5** Black has nothing constructive to do so has to just move back and forth and wait for the hammer blow. Now there is nothing black can do without getting checkmated to stop the queening of the pawn so he resigns. For the sake of education we shall continue. **36.Qe7 Rdx8 37.Rxf8+ Rxf8 38.Qxf8+ Kb7 39.Qg7+ Ka6 40.h7** Do we really need to continue? Black is busted! **Qf5 1-0**
